Dear Camper,

Thanks to the Chaney family's generosity, Atonement Lutheran Church is offering Camp Scholarships again this year! The amount of funding available may depend on how many campers apply. Families will pay the \$100 deposit when they register their child for camp and send in the application below for the balance; the amount to be paid out of the memorial fund will be determined together with Anita Chaney and paid directly to Bear Creek Camp from Atonement. Optional extras are the family's responsibility (Rafting and Canoe trips).

Thanks to Anita and her family, funds for Bear Creek Camp Scholarships will be coming out of the Joe Lewis Memorial Fund (information provided on the reverse). Receiving a scholarship requires your camper to perform certain tasks:

1. Sending a thank you note to the Chaney family (care of Anita Chaney) for the scholarship. Additionally, we may have you write a note from camp to Anita.
2. Be present in worship on a mutually scheduled date to receive a token of said scholarship (actual funds will be sent directly to camp – but this is an acknowledgment in front of the whole community of the receipt of this gift, as well as an encouragement for others to give or go to camp!).
3. Be present in worship the week you are going to camp so we can send you with a blessing!

These scholarships are given in memory of JOSEPH E. LEWIS

Joseph E. Lewis was a partner for over 30 years in the law firm of Stevens and Lee where he served as Vice President of the firm. He was a former president of the Berks County Bar Association.

As a 1958 graduate of Wyomissing High School, he was a four-year letter winner for basketball, football, baseball, and track, and a leader of the teams and various school organizations. He graduated from Dickinson College in 1962 where he was a member of the basketball, football, and baseball teams, and the athletic chairman of his fraternity, Kappa Sigma.

He was a national finalist in 1962 in the Moot Court Trials conducted by law schools. He was admitted into practice in the Supreme Court of the United States. He served as a board member of Big Brothers/Big Sisters, the Berks County Association for the Blind, and Whitfield Lions Club. He was instrumental in the purchase of a new facility for the Big Brothers/Big Sisters and their library was established in his memory. He was selected Berks County Boss of the Year. He was a member of Atonement Lutheran Church and served on Church Council.
